COVID-19 Vaccines Shown Effective in Children and Adults

- + Kaiser Permanente is providing COVID-19 vaccines and boosters to people 6 months and older, with newer versions of these vaccines.
- + Vaccines and boosters remain critical to slowing the spread of COVID-19. They also play a big part in keeping rates of serious illness, hospitalizations and deaths fairly low and stable.
- + It is now recommended that people age 5 years and older get an updated (or bivalent) COVID-19 booster for better protection against the most prevalent omicron variants. Kaiser Permanente provides vaccines and boosters in all regions.
- + Learn how to get a vaccination or booster appointment at kp.org/covidvaccine.
- + A parent or guardian must accompany anyone younger than 18 to their vaccine appointment. Medical staff may ask for the child's photo ID and proof of age before administering the vaccine.



Masks and Other Measures Still Recommended for Safety

- + Wearing a mask, washing your hands, and physical distancing help protect you in public indoor spaces. Although wearing a mask may not be required, it's still important for us all to do so.
